### **Martyn Bone**, lektor i amerikansk litteratur

Mine vigtigste forskningsområder er litteratur og kultur i det sydlige USA, afroamerikansk litteratur og transnationale amerikanske studier. Jeg underviser i en række kurser i amerikansk litteratur, afroamerikansk litteratur, USA's sydstatssitteratur, amerikanske studier og USA's populærmusik.

I det akademiske år 2022-23 er jeg på forskningsorlov støttet af et Carlsbergfondet monografistipendium samt et gæsteforskerstipendium fra University of Sydney (i efterårssemestret 2022).
